

Sean S. Downey is Associate Professor of Anthropology at The Ohio State University and co-Editor-in-Chief of *Human Ecology: An Interdisciplinary Journal*. His research combines complexity science and ethnographic fieldwork to investigate sustainability in Indigenous land-use systems, particularly swidden agriculture. Downey has conducted nearly 20 years of fieldwork with Q'eqchi' Maya communities in Belize and has published in leading journals including PNAS and *Nature Communications*. He is a former NSF CAREER awardee and a 2024–25 Visiting Fellow at the Complexity Science Hub in Vienna. His work advances theoretical and applied understanding of self-organization and resilience in coupled human–natural systems.
