**Sean S. Downey** is Associate Professor of Anthropology at The Ohio State University and co-Editor-in-Chief of Human Ecology: An Interdisciplinary Journal. His research combines complexity science and ethnographic fieldwork to investigate sustainability in Indigenous land-use systems, particularly swidden agriculture. Downey has conducted nearly 20 years of fieldwork with Q'eqchi' Maya communities in Belize and has published in leading journals including PNAS and Nature Communications. He is a former NSF CAREER awardee and a 2024–25 Visiting Fellow at the Complexity Science Hub in Vienna. His work advances theoretical and applied understanding of self-organization and resilience in coupled human–natural systems.
